

MAKING A PAPER INSECT DISPLAY INFO FOR PARENTS

WORKSHOP FROM COWLEY ROAD WORKS



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WHAT EACH CHILD WILL NEED

To make a paper insect display you will need:

- Paper
- Scissors
- Glue, sticky tape or staples

And then anything colourful or with different textures you can find about the house, like:

- Cereal boxes, tea boxes, netting from oranges, plastic toilet roll wrap, milk cartons, plastic bottle caps
- Bubble wrap, Wrapping paper, fabric

You will need access to a printer, to print three key templates:

- [Insect Worksheet](#): to ID the insect
- [Box template](#): to hold the insect
- [Insect data label](#): to display the insect

ADULT SUPERVISION REQUIREMENTS

Most of this project can be undertaken by a child. Adult assistance may be required for:

- **Taking the child to an outside space to look for insects.** This can be done in the garden if you have one, or the pavement on your street, or a local park if you like
- **Identifying the insects the children find.** We suggest using the Woodland Trust's [common insect identification list](#).

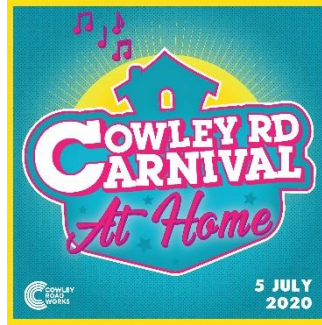
